#### **Sheep Rules**

- A. Entry deadline Sept. 1 (link can be found at <u>www.lonokecountyfair.com</u>).
- B. Open Division entry fee is \$2.50 per head
- C. Registration Papers are required for both Junior and Open division exhibitors in breeding sheep divisions.
- D. Registered ewes shown in the breeding classes can be shown in the market classes.
- E. Exhibitor must have acquired title and taken possession of all livestock animals on or before the ownership date of July 15.
- F. Animals must be registered in exhibitor's name 30 days prior to show (Open Exhibitors Only)
- G. Only 2 entries per class.
- H. All sheep must meet Arkansas Health Regulations.
- I. No premium money will be issued to sheep exhibitors until pen area is cleaned and checked by superintendent.
- J. No full shearing of sheep will be allowed on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are allowed to touchup their animals and prepare for show. All clippings must be cleaned up by the exhibitor.

## Section 1: Breeding Sheep

- a) All breeding sheep must be registered in their respective association.
- b) All animals must have an official scrappie ID tag.
- c) Sheep in spring classes must have lamb teeth.

## Section 2: Junior Wether Dam Lambs

- Wether Dam Lambs are defined as any crossbred animal or may be purebred provided it is not entered in an Arkansas State Fair Breed Show
- No minimum or maximum weigh
- Lambs must be slick shorn (shorn above knees and hocks)
- All lambs must have lamb teeth, no permanent teeth showing
- WDL will be shown by weight. Classes will be determined by superintendent after weigh-in.
- Wether Dam Lambs will be shown in two divisions: Ewe lambs and Yearling Ewes
- Exhibitors are limited to 2 entries per division
- WDL (limited to two per division) may also be shown in the market lamb show.

### **Section 3: Market Lambs**

- a) Entry deadline Sept. 1. (link can be found at <u>www.lonokecountyfair.com</u>).
- b) Exhibitor must have acquired title and taken possession of all livestock animals on or before the ownership date of July 15.
- c) All market lambs must have milk teeth
- d) Market Lambs may be weathers or ewes. Ewes shown in market classes can be shown in breeding sheep classes if they are registered.
- e) No lower or upper weight limits on market lambs, however only lambs weighing 75 and higher will be considered for championship honors.
- f) Market lambs will be shown by weight. Classes will be determined after weigh-in.
- g) An exhibitor may show up to 3 market lambs.
- h) Junior Exhibitors are responsible for being present at weigh-in to officially weigh lambs.
- i) All market lambs must have Scrapie tag in ear and meet all Arkansas Health Requirements.
